Injury Update Noah Weinmann

Spectators on site were left gasping, while fans at home were once again worried about sidecar riders Dan Foden and Noah Weinmann. What had happened? At the start of the second race of the Sidecar GP in Lithuania, the duo got caught up in a violent crash. Dan Foden was unharmed, but Noah Weinmann had to be taken to hospital. Further checks on Monday confirmed the diagnosis from Sunday evening: the 21-year-old suffered a mild concussion and a broken rib, which slightly injured his lung. On Monday afternoon, the German was already able to begin the 1600-kilometre journey home.

"We were very lucky," Noah realises, knowing the consequences of the start crash could have been much worse. "I just have to take it easy for 14 days now. The next GP in the Netherlands is still five weeks away. By then I should be fit again," the passenger remains fearless even after the horror crash.
