



Foden/Weinmann: GP in Straßbessenbach/D

Comeback better than expected

"This result was clearly beyond our expectations," explained Dan Foden briefly after finishing fifth in the second race. Eight weeks after the last race and five weeks after the surgery of rider Dan Foden's broken thumb, Foden/Weinmann's sporting comeback actually exceeded the plan.

It began as intended. The track of the second German World Championship race in Straßbessenbach (near Frankfurt) is considered physically very demanding due to many hard landings. "We held back a bit in training to protect Dan's hand," explained passenger Noah Weinmann about the unusual starting position in the second row. In this sense, twelfth place in the first of the two nearly 30-minute races was acceptable.

Positive: Dan Foden's hand, stabilised with tape, had largely handled the strain without pain. An unexpectedly successful start and regained confidence in physical resilience propelled the British-German team back to their former strength in the second run. The reward: fifth place.

The team's comeback comes at the right time. The World Championship moves on to the next rounds in Latvia and Lithuania over the next two weekends.
